knowledge - $\checkmark \checkmark$ ANSWER $\checkmark \checkmark$ -The ability to recall and repeat information you have memorized.

ethics - \checkmark ANSWER \checkmark - A system of standards or moral principles that direct actions as being right or wrong

What 4 things make up Bloom's Taxonomy? - √√ANSWER√√-Knowledge, comprehension, application, analysis What 3 factors influence critical thinking? - $\checkmark \checkmark$ ANSWER $\checkmark \checkmark$ -upbringing and culture, motivation, attitude influences thinking

directed thinking - $\checkmark \checkmark$ ANSWER $\checkmark \checkmark$ -purposeful and outcome-oriented (doing a job directly)

Negative thinking - $\checkmark \checkmark$ ANSWER $\checkmark \checkmark$ -the mind is stuck on negative thoughts and blocks worthwhile thinking (emotional sabotage)

Nonfocused thinking - $\checkmark \checkmark$ ANSWER $\checkmark \checkmark$ -you engaged your brain out of habbit without much conscious thought (off topic)

What is the western secular belief system? - \checkmark ANSWER \checkmark - Individual autonomy- freedom to chose,

Individual rights- their rights cannot restrict the rights of others (rights of the individuals)

What was the first state to pass a law licensing practical nurses, and when? - $\sqrt{4}$ ANSWER $\sqrt{4}$ -1914, Mississippi

What did Florence Nightingale do? - $\checkmark \checkmark$ ANSWER $\checkmark \checkmark$ -went to Crimea with 38 women.

in 1860, she established a training school

(planning you school, work, and home schedule)

Ruminative thinking - $\checkmark \checkmark$ ANSWER $\checkmark \checkmark$ -the same situation or scene is replayed in your mind over and over without reaching an outcome.

(instant replay)
